

I look forward to seeing you all as soon as possible and I wish you all the very best .



Many of the drag queen vocals can be lip synced, some can be sung, depending on casting.

MUSICAL NUMBERS

Most numbers are group songs - if the drag queens are singing, they are usually accompanied by the 3 divas who are major players.

There is lots more work for the ensemble in the stage show than in the film and this is the main draw for the cast.

The good news is that there is a lot that you currently love about the Society:

Ease of making new friends, the camaraderie, excellent facilities at Queens Hall, the many talented members, seeing the younger ones doing their stuff, the social aspects and the professional productions that we all put on.

One of the emerging themes from the survey was the type and variety of shows the Society puts on – many members may not be aware but Directors need to pitch for shows and there is also a controlled limited availability of shows and unfortunately not all of those you would like to do are available – but the selection Committee is listening and always open to chat about potential shows and to pitches.

The Committee has been reviewing pitches for next year as we speak - watch this space!

CODS Needs a Change of Leadership!


This happens gradually anyway, with committee members stepping down sometimes or changing roles. We always try our best and sometimes can't please everyone!

A MESSAGE FROM HATCH....

Prompted by lockdown and by some of the responses to our survey I have been considering how best I can continue helping CODS and still enjoy that part of my life!

I have discussed this with the rest of the committee and have decided that I will be stepping down from the committee and stepping back from my other roles within the society. Right at the moment there is probably no urgency to do this for me. I will definitely leave the committee at the next AGM but could leave earlier if someone comes forward to take over as the Honorary Secretary.

So would you like to take on any of the following roles?

Honorary Secretary - you would need to be part of the executive committee. The role includes; Support the committee in all its deliberations, assist other committee officers, promote the society, secretarial support, maintain membership list. Issue guidelines and duties to show directors, send out newsletter to members, invite VIPs to productions. Co-administrator of ticketsource website.

Props Master. Responsible for our props store at Flishinghurst. To either help a shows props person, or be the shows props person. This person to get a props list from a shows director, discuss this list with the director go through the store to source props along with borrowing, purchasing or having made any other props, discussing any costs. Also to be available at least for show week to (possibly also earlier rehearsals) to organise props for each rehearsal and show, handing them to cast members or placing them on set.

Programme Editor. In discussion with director and others, organise content of the programme (via MS Publisher or similar). Forward to director and committee for ongoing error checking, agree number to be printed and forward MS Publisher and all other files to printer to arrange printing and delivery.

Newsletter Editor. Agree deadlines and release dates with committee (mainly chair) request content (committee and members) and organise via MS Publisher or similar. PDF version to committee for error checking/approval. Once approved PDF to Hon Sec (if different person) to email to membership. Hon Sec or Editor to print and post newsletter to snail mail members.

COVID-19 IMPRICT ON CODS FINANCES

Having just received the 2019 accounts back from McCabe Ford Williams – who I must thank again for their commitment during this difficult time – I felt it might be a good idea to update you all on our finances.

Like almost every other part of society, CODS has been impacted by the coronavirus situation. Fortunately, we were in a reasonably healthy position financially beforehand, particularly following the Centenary Meal and because we had not already paid for rehearsal space and other items that we aren't able to use. Any commitments to this year's shows – for example the rights and puppets for Arabian Nights – can be carried over and re-used when we are able to restart performances.

So we are left with needing to cover the usual fixed costs of rental for Flishinghurst and possibly the Gray Room, as well as insurance and things like the website that we can't avoid. These will be between £2000-3000 – which will leave a significant hole in our balance if we have no income to cover it -we would normally rely on membership fees and the pantomime to do this.

Thank you to all of those members who have continued to pay their subscriptions in these difficult times and if anyone else who has not renewed their membership wishes to do so the details of the bank account are below. As a reminder, following this year's virtual AGM, we are no longer accepting any new monthly payments, so the full subscription is due.

DENNY ON LOCKDOWN!

While we can't, for now, get back to the Queens Hall for rehearsals and our shows there is still lots that we can do to get our AmDram fix! I hope it might be useful to share with you what I have been doing online theatre wise during the lockdown.

All of these courses have been with Professional theatre actors / practitioners / Speech and vocal coaches / Props and prosthetic designers and constructors.

Vocal techniques - lots of exercises and guidance as to how to use the voice

Play writing - a short script, and how to know your characters

Acting for the Screen - how it is different from acting for the stage

How to spot a fake American accent

Stage Management and the role of the DSM and ASM (have done lots on this over the years)

Mask making

Puppetry (I did a week's long course on this a while ago)

Production guidelines

Society organisation and legal aspects thereof

Dance

Costume design and recycling

Every day since March 18th I have also been involved in activities that have been of a creative nature, with the Director of NODA Summer school and some professional theatre practitioners.

A picture is posted and we imagine we are one of the characters in it. We write a short piece of dialogue.

We change the outcomes of well known stories by altering an action that would do this e.g. "No Romeo, I am not going to meet with you tonight. There is a law in this country that forbids it and I am busy with my mates and washing my hair."

We describe an item as if it were a person.

We describe us as if we were an animal

DENNY ON LOCKDOWN!

Someone starts a story and we continue it: The night was dark as he gazed into the distance, standing still at the top of the cliffs, and all that could be heard was the crashing of the waves. Lee turned round expecting to see (Next person carries on etc)

A discussion about Proverbs

A picture of an object - what is it, what could it be?

Writing a short paragraph describing an object e.g. a pencil

Writing a brief passage inspired from a song by Abba, The Beatles

We have written short monologues, we have filmed ourselves using our eyes, we have done so much!

I am also taking part in courses in August doing Costume, Stage management, Sound, Design and Accents. I am going to be busy!


